 7/16/1936 The Edward Hirsbrunner home on the La Grange Road Ormsby station was destroyed by fire.
 8/7/1936 J. B. Lewisbetter's barn at Douglas Place on Shelbyville Road, near Middletown was destroyed by fire.
 8/14/1936 Palmer Asbestos and Rubber Corporation suffered \$5,0000 loss by fire.
 8/21/1936 Brookside Egg Farm (300 chickens) destroyed on Shelbyville Road near Middletown.
 1/8/1937 Nick's Nursery, on Shelbyville Road had serious fire.
 7/30/1937 Weikel Farm on Shelbyville Pike had a barn destroyed by fire.
 9/3/1937 Major barn fire at Arterburn farm on Shelbyville Road
 9/21/1937 Holy Trinity Church Fire on Frankfort Avenue, major damage.
 3/11/1938 Four apartment units under construction on Wiltshire Avenue, owned by N. B. West were destroyed.
 10/14/1938 Barn destroyed on Hurstbourne Farms, owned by Mrs. A. T. Hert.
 11/9/1938 Major fire destroyed 9 buildings on Smizer farm at Westport and Goose Creek Roads
 11/18/1938 St. Matthews Lumber and Manufacturing Co., destroyed by fire on Thierman Lane.
 11/25/1938 Luther McDaniel, colored farmhand on the James P. Helm, III farm died in a barn fire.
 1/13/1939 The home of Rattterman, 309 Ridgeway was destroyed.
 4/1/1939 St. Matthews Tavern was destroyed by fire.
 7/28/1939 Barn destroyed on the farm of John Monohan, Browns Lane.
 8/4/1939 O. B. Weitzel, Lyndon lost his barn on Lyndon Lane.
 8/18/1939 Von Allmen dairy farm lost a barn.
 8/18/1939 Three room tenant house on the farm of Edward Monohan was destroyed.
 11/17/1939 Three room home of Irene Rewson, Negro, at Rosedale on Shelvyville Road was destroyed by fire.
 11/24/1939 Three room tenant house on the Stutzenberger farm at Hikes Point was destroyed.
 12/25/1939 The home of Charles Leibson of 429 Oxford, explosion, entire house destroyed.

3/10/1940 Jeffersontown School, flames through the roof.
 12/20/1940 P. Willett Hagan home at 3710 Davis avenue had several thousand dollars of damage from a fire.
 1/3/1941 Large dairy farm of Robert C. Tway, at Plainview Dairy Farms on Hurstbourne Lane near Shelbyville Road.
 2/21/1941 The home of E. W. Cunningham, on Dorsey Lane was destroyed.
 3/14/1941 The home of P. M. Russell at Pewee Valley was destroyed. Two story frame residence.
 2/6/1942 Judge Humphrey's home at 4095 Massie Avenue. Quick stop prevented much damage.
 3/6/1942 A blaze at White castle was quickly brought under control.
 11/13/1942 The home of Alan Chanell, 162 Whiltshire avenue was heavily damaged.
 6/11/1943 Lightning struck the home of Clyde Branham, 3937 Gilman Avenue damaging the upstairs.
 11/1943 St. Matthews Motor Company, Frankfort Avenue & Chenoweth Lane, 17 cars destroyed in \$75,000 fire.
 1/14/1944 George Parker Beam, Jr. 18 months old, 610 Wallace Avenue, died from the result of burns suffered when the crib in which he was playing caught fire.
 4/7/1944 Apartment fire at 3511 Lexington Road owned by J. A. MacMilan suffered fire damage.
 12/29/1944 Home of Dr. J. A. Ohlson, 229 Cornell Place suffered fire damage.
 5/11/1945 A & P Food Market at Lexington & Wendover Avenue was destroyed by fire.
 1947 Chamberlain Company of America, warehouse
 August 1949 4020 Alon Road, \$5,000 damage to E. A. Bowden's home. Second floor.

- 6/28/1952 Louisville Boat Club, Cabin Cruiser.
- 2/2/1953 Seven year old Eleanor Abell died of suffocation from smoke in her room over the breezeway in her home on Overlook Rd. in Mockingbird Valley.
- 9/3/1953 Three men were burned painfully this morning in an explosion and fire that destroyed a 32-foot cabin cruiser at its dock in the Pastime Boat Club harbor, 3015 Upper River Road.
- 9/25/1953 Power Transformers exploded at the LG&E site at Breckinridge Lane near where the Watterson Expressway is now. Fire departments from Jeffersontown, St. Matthews, Lyndon, Buechel and Louisville fought the blaze.
- 10/29/1953 Portable building at Greathouse School on Grandview.
- 12/3/1953 Officials Probe Possibility of Arson In 6 Fires In St. Matthews Area. In Bellewood, near St. Matthews, two fires within two blocks of each other yesterday afternoon fanned the suspicions of authorities. One was in a shed on the property of James S. Younger, 3940 Gilman. The other blaze destroyed a garage owned by Carl Ratterman, 3904 Brookfield. One of three buildings of Davis' St. Matthews Feed & Seed Store, 225 Chenoweth Lane, was damaged in a fire November 17. Hawkins noted that about 6 p.m. November 15 there were fires in an outbuilding at the home of N. O. Rudy, 3916 Elmwood, and in a garage at the home of Henry E. Gerlach, 3929 Gilman. The two buildings were across an alley from each other in Bellewood. Between 4:30 and 5 p.m. November 19, Hawkins added, there was a blaze in a shed behind the Wilken Café, 3819 Frankfort Avenue, about four blocks from the other blazes.
- 12/8/1953 Chief's Garage Hit by Blaze At Bellewood. 9th Fire In 3 Weeks; Fire was discovered shortly after 5 p.m. in a garage at 3909 Elmwood, the home of John M. Monohan.
