
South-Central Arizona - 1920



Ruby Began to Grow in 1917 When Mining of Lead and Zinc Started




The Ruby Mercantile was Built in 1915





The U.S. Cavalry Protected Southern Arizona from Mexican Revolutionaries and Bandits





The Fate of the Fraser Brother Murderers

• Ezequiel Lara — Imprisoned in Sonora Mexico for another killing in August 1921

• Manuel Garcia – Killed in shootout by Deputy Sheriffs
George McLure and George Holloway
on October 12, 1920

Letter to Ines Fraser from Deputy Sheriff McLure

(Two Weeks after the Garcia Shootout)

"I received your appreciated letter [of concern] this morning and will say that I am near recovery, only a little weak. . . I am very glad that Garcia has run his race and will bother no one else. To say that he was cruel, puts it mildly.

You may rest assured that if Lara is heard of again in this Country, that the sheriff's office here will do all in its power to capture or kill him . . "






Layout of the Ruby Mercantile

- Second trial: 05/18/22 - 06/04/22 Convicted

Sentenced to Life Imprisonment


- Third trial: 06/27/22 - 07/12/22 Mistrial

Manuel Martinez


- Trial: 05/16/22 - 05/18/22 Convicted

Five Days after Escaping from an Automobile Wreck Martinez and Silvas were Recaptured




Manuel Martinez was Hanged on August 10, 1923



Myths Corrected

- The Fraser and Pearson robberies/murders were <u>not</u> committed by the same gang
- Deputy Sheriff Holloway was not killed by Manuel Garcia
- Ezequiel Lara was brought to justice
- Elizabeth Purcell, Mrs. Pearson's sister, <u>did</u> testify at the trials of Silvas and Martinez
- Silvas and Martinez were known to Ruby residents
- Silvas and Martinez did <u>not</u> kill Sheriff White during their escape while being transported to Florence prison
- Silvas and Martinez were <u>not</u> "railroaded" to prison/gallows without a "fair trial"

Epilog – Frasers

- Ines Fraser returned to San Diego after settling her husband's affairs
- She taught at a Montessori School, a primary school, and eventually taught children with learning disabilities
- She continued writing poetry several poems published
- Ines lived with family members until her death in 1970
- Ines' daughter, Constance Fraser, born just 2 ½ months before her father's murder, grew up in San Diego
- Constance married George Austin Kiely in 1942 moved around the country quite a bit with the Air Force
- Constance returned to Arizona in the late 1960's resides today in central Arizona

- Margaret Pearson was raised by Myrtle Pearson's sister, Elizabeth Purcell (later Mrs. Woody Gatlin), in Patagonia, Arizona
- Frank Pearson's sister, Irene Pearson, returned to Texas with no known subsequent connection to Arizona
- Margaret Pearson married William H. Anderson in 1937, retired from a long teaching career in Nogales in 1976, and resides today in southern California
